

Disruptive Behavior

Ask the student to stop the disruptive behavior

Behavior Continues

Direct student to leave classroom for the remainder of the class period*

Security may be contacted at 52246 if the student refused to leave, or if situation escalates

Direct the student to meet outside of class before next class period

Student presented with specific problem behaviors

Impact of earning process is explained

Verbal warning issued that behavior will not be tolerated in future

Issue Remains Unresolved

Student fails to meet with instructor;

Meeting between the instructor and student is unlikely to yield positive results;

Behavior Escalates

Student Referred to Student Development

- Behavior Discussed
- Student Conduct Code Violations Identified
- Facilitated learning process through developmentally appropriate interventions.
 - Warning
 - Probation
 - Community Restitution
 - Educational Work or Programming
 - Suspension/Expulsion with Hearing

* A student may only be dismissed from class at the time of disruption, and may return to the next class. If the issue remains unresolved, the instructor may request the student meets with Student Development prior to returning to class. Student Development will assist in the facilitation of this intervention *if it can be shown that the student continues to be noncompliant or disruptive* (for example, if the student was directed to meet with the instructor and failed to follow up, s/he may be asked to leave the subsequent class based on noncompliance, and referred directly to Student Development.)
