Please note that the pre-requisites for applying to the program have changed to following:

- English Composition CT State-ENG1010 completed with a grade of C or higher
- Anatomy & Physiology I CT State-BIO2111 completed with a grade of C or higher within 5 years of application deadline (February 1, 2024).
- Anatomy & Physiology II CT State-BIO2112 completed with a grade of C or higher within 5 years of application deadline (February 1, 2024). **Note:** the student can apply to the program while in the process of completing this course, but they must complete the course with a grade of C or higher to maintain eligibility status. Also, not that this grade will not be counted in the application score.
- Pre-Calculus CT State-MAT1610 completed with a grade of C or higher within 5 years of application deadline (February 1, 2024).
- Participate in an interview.
- Attendance at one Gateway Campus Radiation Therapy program information session within 12 months of application deadline (February 1, 2024).

Please Note: Official transcripts from other institutions must be sent electronically to the Admissions Office for transfer credit evaluation

This is a full-time, program with a clinical component as assigned.

- Clinical rotations are scheduled from 8a-5p. If the hours at a clinical site are different than the regular scheduled hours, students will follow the schedule of the clinical site they are assigned.
- 40 hour/week clinical shifts during winter & summer intersession
- Students are required to rotate through all clinical sites as assigned
