Please note that the pre-requisites for applying to the program have changed to following:

- English Composition CT State - ENG1010 (formerly - ENG*101) completed with a grade of C or higher
- Anatomy & Physiology I CT State - BIO2111 (formerly - BIO*211), completed with a grade of C+ or higher within 5 years of application deadline (February 1, 2024).
- Anatomy & Physiology II CT State - BIO2112 (formerly - BIO*212), completed with a grade of C+ or higher within 5 years of application deadline (February 1, 2024).

Note: the student can apply to the program while in the process of completing this course, but they must complete the course with a grade of C+ or higher to maintain eligibility status. Also note that this grade will not be counted in the application score.

- Eligible for MATH1600: Pathway to Calculus: College Algebra (formerly – MAT172) by the fall 2024 semester
- TEAS test score of 60 or higher taken within 3 years prior to the application deadline (February 1, 2024)
- Attendance at one Gateway campus Radiography program information session within 12 months of application deadline (February 1, 2024). <https://gatewayct.edu/academics/academic-departments/allied-health>

Please Note:

Official transcripts from other institutions must be sent electronically to the Admissions Office for transfer credit evaluation.

This is a full-time, day program with an evening clinical component as assigned.

- Clinical rotations are scheduled from 8a-4p or 4p – 10p. If the hours at a satellite office are different than the regular scheduled hours, students will follow the schedule of the clinical site they are assigned.
- Students do not have the option to choose day or evening clinical rotations
- 35 hour/week clinical shifts during winter & summer intersession
- Students are required to rotate through all clinical sites as assigned
- Students are required to receive all vaccinations that the clinical sites require
